Note any combination from these two lists will work as long as they add up to four courses. **The final two science courses** can be completed (C- or higher) from any science course offered by the UO or from a transferring college. This includes online science courses and / or science courses that do not include labs or discussion sessions. Please note if taking a course at another college, please be sure that the course transfers as a science course.
