Doctoral students most often request a waiver to substitute previous graduate level coursework for required doctoral courses. To waive a course, a student prepares a petition that includes (a) a brief statement listing the course(s) asking to be waived; (b) the instructor's signature for the course, indicating that the instructor approves of the course(s) waiver; (c) the advisor's signature; and (d) the syllabus of the course(s) already taken that covers the required course content. To ensure consistency in waiver decisions, petitions are discussed between the advisor and core faculty. Faculty consider the extent to which prior coursework adequately covers the content area. Courses for which a grade of C or lower was earned cannot be waived. Courses taken more than 5 years ago cannot be used as a substitute. Graduate level ethics courses will not be approved for waiving unless the APA ethics code was the focus of the course and the course was taken within the past 2 years. Students may transfer graduate credits that were not earned toward an awarded degree.
